Geographical Locations and Bordering Regions

Seas Bordering Specific Countries

- Turkey: Bordered by the Black Sea (north), the Aegean Sea (west), and the Mediterranean Sea (south).
- Italy: Bordered by several seas, including:
 - Tyrrhenian Sea (bounded by Italy, Sicily, Sardinia, and Corsica).
 - Adriatic Sea (borders Italy and Albania, with Croatia on its coast).

Inland Seas and Lakes

- Caspian Sea: The world's largest inland body of water.
- Aral Sea: An inland sea bordered by Kazakhstan and Uzbekistan.

Countries Bordering Major Seas

1. Mediterranean Sea

- Bordering Countries: Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, Israel, Lebanon, Syria, Turkey, Greece, Albania, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Slovenia, Italy, France, Spain.
- o Non-Bordering Countries: Jordan, Iraq, Chad, Saudi Arabia.

2. Black Sea

- Bordering Countries: Turkey, Bulgaria, Romania, Ukraine, Russia, Georgia.
- Non-Bordering Countries: Syria, Croatia.

Other Specific Locations

- Baku, the capital of Azerbaijan, is located on the coast of the Caspian Sea.
- The Red Sea is an example of an axial trough formed by tectonic activity.

Unique Characteristics of Specific Seas

Sargasso Sea

- Location: North Atlantic Ocean.
- Uniqueness: A sea without a coastline, defined by surrounding ocean currents.
- Characteristics:
 - Contains large amounts of floating marine vegetation called Sargassum.
 - Known for its warm, highly saline waters.

Caspian Sea

- Characteristic: The world's largest inland sea.
- Bordering Countries: Includes Kazakhstan (among others).

Red Sea

• **Formation:** Created by tectonic activity, making it an example of an axial trough.

Spatial Sequences

West-to-East Sequence of Seas: Mediterranean Sea → Black Sea
→ Caspian Sea → Aral Sea.
