Regional Name	Primary States / Regions of Practice
Jhum / Jhoom	Hilly areas of Assam, Bihar (now Jharkhand), and North-East India.
Kumari	Western Ghats.
Walter	South-East Rajasthan.
Dahiya	Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh.
Pondu	Odisha.
Poonam	Kerala.
Mashan	Madhya Pradesh (not Himachal Pradesh).

Performing Arts of Manipur

Art Form	Description
Khongjom Parba	A traditional ballad singing style from Manipur. It narrates the story of the 1891 Anglo-Manipuri War and is accompanied by a Dholak drum.
Thang-Ta	A traditional martial art form from Manipur. It involves the use of weapons like swords (Thang) and spears (Ta).
