Reason for Resignatio n	A major dispute with the right-wing faction (supported by Gandhi) over the formation of the Congress Working Committee.
Core of Dispute	Gandhi strongly disagreed with Bose's radical ideas and methods.
Successor	Dr. Rajendra Prasad became the next President of the INC.

Subhash Chandra Bose's Worldview

View on World War II

• Bose saw the war between Germany and Britain as a **"godsent opportunity"** for India.

- His strategy was to **exploit Britain's difficulty** during the war to advance India's cause for independence.
- He subscribed to the Irish nationalist saying: "England's difficulty is Ireland's opportunity."
