Indian National Congress & World War II

1. Official Stance and Demands

- Condition for Cooperation: The Congress policy was to offer cooperation to Britain only if they were given a full and immediate assurance of Complete Independence.
- Refusal of Support: They refused to support the war effort without this guarantee.
- Condemnation of Axis Powers: The Congress condemned Nazism,
 Fascism, and the Nazi invasion of Poland.

2. Reason for Resignation (1939)

- **British Action:** The British Viceroy, Lord Linlithgow, declared India a participant in the war against Germany without consulting the Indian Legislature or elected councils.
- Congress Response: In protest against this unilateral action, the Congress Ministries in all provinces resigned in October 1939.
- Tenure: They had been in power for 28 months before resigning.

3. Nature of Collaboration

- The Indian National Congress did not actively collaborate or assist the British in World War II.
- Their stated position was that India could not be compelled to fight a war to defend democracy while being denied that same freedom itself.

The British Government's Actions

Declaration of War

- Britain made India a part of World War II without the consent of Indian representatives.
- The Viceroy, Lord Linlithgow, announced India's entry into the war on October 17, 1939.

World War II Timeline & Key Figures

Duration of the War



- World War II began on September 1, 1939, with Germany's invasion of Poland.
- The war ended in **1945** after the U.S. dropped atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, Japan.

Leadership

 Winston Churchill was the Prime Minister of Britain during World War II (from 1940 to 1945).
